The celebration featured technical sessions, expert talks, a grant distribution ceremony under MASTEC's student innovation scheme, and interactive sessions with key dignitaries. The event offered a valuable platform for engaging students and faculty in discussions on the role of intellectual property in education, entrepreneurship, and cultural preservation.

Objectives of the Programme

The primary objective of organizing the **World Intellectual Property Day 2025** at Manipur Technical University is to raise awareness about the importance of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) in fostering creativity, innovation, and economic growth.
